Event Specifications

SCOPE OF CONTEST

The contestant will make a verbal five to six minute presentation on their choice of three subjects. The presentation will be judged on the content and quality of the written material and the delivery of that material to the audience.

Subjects:

- Climate Change
- Internet Fame
- Leadership

NUMBER OF COMPETITORS

Individual event, limited to 16 competitors.

Fresno ROP reserves the right to modify enrollment due to limited spaces available.

RULES AND PROCEDURES

- Contestant's written production will be the result of their own efforts. It is expected that they will take advantage
 of all available training facilities in their local school in developing their speaking and writing ability. Facts and
 working data may be secured from any source.
- 2. Contestants are required to supply the following:
 - A signed statement of originality
 - One typed copy of the verbal presentation
- 3. A contestant who is not present at the time of drawing for speaking order shall not be eligible for the competition.
- 4. Each speech shall be a minimum of five (5) minutes in length and a maximum of six (6) minutes. Each contestant will be allowed one to two (1-2) minutes additional time in which he/she will be asked questions relating to his/her speech.
- 5. Contestants shall draw for places on the program. The program chairperson shall then introduce each contestant by name, in the order of the drawing. A contestant will be permitted to use notes while speaking, but deduction in scoring may be made for this practice, if it detracts from the effectiveness of the presentation. Applause shall be withheld until all contestants have spoken.
- 6. Two timekeepers shall be designated and will record the time used by each contestant in delivering their speech, noting under time and overtime, if any, for which deduction should be made. Timekeepers should be sitting together.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Prior to the contest, the judges will be furnished with a copy of the contest rules and a typed copy of the contestant's verbal presentation, which they will read and grade on content and composition, recording their judgment on a score sheet.
- 2. At the time of the contest, the judges will be seated in different sections of the room in which the contest is held. They will score each contestant upon delivery of their production, using the score sheet provided.
- 3. When all contestants have finished speaking, each judge will total their score on composition and delivery of each contestant. The timekeeper's record will be used in computing the final score for each contestant.
- 4. The judges' ranking on each contestant shall be added by the event manager and the winner shall be the contestant whose total points are the highest. Other placing shall be determined in the same manner (low points score method of selection). In case of a tie, that individual who has the highest grand total score shall have prior rating.
- 5. Deductions of 20 points per minute, or major fraction thereof, will be made from the score of each judge for speeches fewer than five (5) minutes or over six (6) minutes in length. (To prevent being penalized, a contestant must speak for over five (5) minutes, 30 seconds and under six (6) minutes, 30 seconds.)
